L@fter Transport

As our PE extra-curricular clubs have begun our L@fter transport service has also resumed. If your child would like to use this service, they need to book on the bus at Reception by breaktime on the day they wish to use it. You will be able to pay for this service via Arbor shortly as soon as we are able to set this up. Unfortunately, if we do not have enough students book on, we will have to cancel the bus, but we will always let your child know if this happens. Wider clubs and activities will be starting in the coming weeks, and we will update you with a revised timetable later in September.

Attendance matters

Today, in the second week back after the summer holiday, nearly 5% of our students are absent from school. 7% of Year 11 students, those in the most important examination year of their lives, are absent. We have become used to these statistics and sadly, these patterns of absence are now considered normal in schools. Indeed, our attendance is in line with national and local averages.

Totals and averages mean little other than to illustrate the problem we face in school. What matters most, is your child's attendance. We appreciate the cost of living crisis and as a school we are doing everything we can to support our students. However, missing two weeks for a family holiday taken in term time will mean that your child has missed 50 hours of learning new things which they will never be taught again but will face questions on in an exam in the future. Having broken attendance (a day off every week or fortnight, on random days) means that students will miss five hours of new learning each time but will struggle to understand the work they do the following week because lessons are taught in sequences which rely on prior knowledge.

We have highlighted the significant correlation between absence and exam results on previous occasions. Put simply, students who miss school regularly, reduce their lifetime learning potential because they achieve worse exam results than their peers, and develop poor habits to take into the workplace where high levels of absence, poor punctuality, or an indifferent attitude to responsibility can result in dismissal.


As a school we are very worried about this situation, and we are not alone in our concern. Both Ofsted and the Government agree and have highlighted the issue in recent weeks. Please can I ask that if your child is absent from school regularly (students should have full attendance most weeks) you seek to address this and ask us for support if you are struggling with your child. We want to work alongside you to support your child and we can only do this if you speak to us.

As part of our drive to support families and further improve our safeguarding practices, we have appointed a new family liaison officer, Mrs Stokes. Mrs Stokes knows our students well and is a trained safeguarding lead. Mrs Stokes will often make home visits to students who are not in school if any of the following apply:

- we have not seen the student in school for two consecutive days;
- we are unable to contact parents/carers after two days;
- we have no information as to the whereabouts of the student;
- there is involvement from Children's Services with the family.

Please be welcoming to Mrs Stokes should she have to visit your child when they are absent. She is here to help and make your child's return to school seamless. Please share openly any concerns or difficulties with her and she will ensure she communicates that information with the relevant staff.

For all students attendance is an issue, but for those students in Year 11, this is an urgent situation which needs to be rectified immediately. Thank you for your continued support. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Mr Wood on kristien.wood@laconchildeschool.co.uk



MyVoice

MyVoice is a reporting system that we are use in school to enable our students and parents to report any safeguarding concerns they may have. This platform provides a secure and quick way to reach out to us and alert of us of any concerns they have. We understand that students don't always feel comfortable to speaking to an adult in the first instance and so MyConcerns is available 24/7 for students. Any report made to MyVoice will send an automatic alert straight to our safeguarding team. A member of the team will be able to read and take the relevant action in a timely manner. Parents/carers can use this link and QR code to the right to report a concern.
