Dear Parent/Carers,

As the new academic year is here, I would like to welcome our students to Lacon Childe School. I hope you have had a relaxing and enjoyable summer and are feeling prepared ready for the academic year ahead.

It is an exciting time to be a student at Lacon Childe School as this year, as we re-introduce the Lacon Way. This is something that wholly embodies our culture at Lacon and what makes us different to other schools. We have listened to the thoughts and comments for parents/carers and students and have made some alterations to the Uniform and Behaviour policy. Staff will be asking students to embody our ethos and be a part of 'more than just a school'. Here at Lacon Childe, we are more than just a school. We are ambitious for ourselves as individuals and of each other - both staff and students alike.

Together, we set high expectations and standards of ourselves and strive to achieve excellence in all that we do, however small. Commitment will be shown through consistently delivering on those expectations, going the extra mile to get the job done and giving 100% in all that we do. We aim for students to approach everything with a 'can-do attitude'. Integrity is doing the right thing - even when that means facing a difficulty or challenge. We will treat others with respect and honesty, take care of our whole school environment and utilise knowledge and understanding wisely. Creativity will underpin everything that we do, as we absorb new knowledge and seek innovative solutions for our students and staff alike - so that we achieve everything we are capable of. Tutor Time

Every school day starts the same with students attending a tutor time. These sessions will provide a consistent and positive start for all students and enable us to fully prepare them and get the students school ready. We will have opportunities in these sessions for the students to focus on important events throughout the school year and developing positive character values, amongst many others. One meeting each week will be dedicated to the development of literacy through our Lacon reads programme. The sessions will be used also to check attendance, equipment, reading logs and support with uniform expectations. Most importantly, form time will give us a chance to celebrate our successes as a year group on a daily and weekly basis.

Attendance

Our attendance target for this year is 100%. Excellent attendance is crucial and recent research has confirmed that there is a link between good mental health, academic achievement, and attendance. I ask for your support in getting your child into school to ensure they have the greatest chance of achieving their full potential.

Equipment

This letter is an opportunity to remind you of the equipment we expect students to have in school with them. The time taken providing forgotten equipment for a lesson adds up over a week, a month, a year, and is time taken from learning. As a school, we do everything to minimise the impact of this, to ensure students have the best opportunity for success, by checking everyone is equipped at the start

of the day. However, it is up to students to take responsibility for their equipment during the school day. Below is a reminder of what your child needs every day:

- School Bag
- Exercise books
- Black and Purple Pens and a spare
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Calculator
- PE Kit (when timetabled)
- DT Apron (When Timetabled)
- Reading book

I understand the safety aspect of your child having a mobile phone on them during their journey to and from school, however during school hours mobile phones will need to be switched off and not visible. Phones seen in school will be confiscated and taken to the school office and students can collect at the end of the day.

Uniform

If a student arrives at school without the correct uniform, we will always support them to correct this. We have a uniform store and where possible, uniform will always be provided. However, if this is not possible, we ask that the student remains in our pastoral support room in social time until the situation is resolved. I look forward to seeing the excellent uniform standards that Year 7 students will set this year.
