Guest speaker: Derek Larkin (Retired criminal Lawyer)

Students taking Religious Studies at GCSE, and selected students who have expressed an interest in criminology, sociology, and careers in the law, were privileged to have retired lawyer Derek Larkin as a guest speaker, to talk to them about his 50-year career as a criminal Lawyer. He spoke to our students about the changes to the law throughout his career and told Year 11 about the university route into the law. He also explained his route into the law through the Chartered Institute for Legal Executives and pointed students towards The Law Society for information and advice into how to get into the law. In addition, Mr Larkin spoke to students about a variety of different jobs within the law including his own role as a lawyer, solicitors, barristers, probation officers, police officers, and a variety of other different roles. This allowed students to ask questions about these roles, and some students asked some brilliant questions about Mr Larkin's approach to the law, and the ways that people should be sentenced and given custodial sentences. Students asked Mr Larkin on his views on sentencing and certainty in the law, asking if he felt crimes like burglary, and stealing should have harsher sentences, or that there should be more of a change in society. Students listened well, and those who asked questions were very thoughtful in their approach. Mr Larkin was pleased with his time spent at Lacon Childe and, and commented on how well behaved our students were, and that they did our school proud. Thanks go to Mrs Blizzard for organising this excellent opportunity for our students.

Science Homework

Thank you to our students who have responded brilliantly to the homework expectations in science this academic year, making great use of the retrieval activities to enhance their studies. A reminder about what they have been working on:

Year 7

Our Year 7 students have a bespoke booklet of questions and are set the homework by one of their 3 teachers. This could be Biology, Chemistry of Physics and is checked weekly (with page numbers on Arbor).

Year 8

In Year 8, students have been using revision clocks and flash cards to support them in retrieving key knowledge. They have picked up this style of revision brilliantly and are making good use of the revision clocks, particularly when preparing for end of unit tests. Students are set three short, separate homework's each week to represent Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

Year 9

Between September and Christmas, students were set homework for the unit they were studying, in the form of a revision clock or flash cards. They completed these very well and made useful notes to use as a revision tool later in the unit, which was a great way for them to work on their retrieval skills. Since January, students are using a bespoke booklet with exam style questions based on previous lessons (so again looking at recall and retrieval). They are set one homework (10-15mins) from each science, each week.

Years 10 and 11

A huge thank you to parents/carers for purchasing the revision guide and workbook. Students are set pages from these weekly, for each science. Students are making the most of the extra recall and exam practice, and it is paying dividends!

Well done to all of our students, keep up the fab work!


