Dear Parents/Carers,

This week's assemblies have focused on the importance of homework and a reminder of the reasons why we revised our homework policy in September. If a student completes an hour's homework per school night for five years, it is the equivalent of an extra school year. In addition:

- It can help students to make more rapid progress in learning.
- It can provide students with the opportunity to:
 - practise further what has been learnt in class.
 - apply what they have learnt in new contexts or situations.
 - prepare them for future learning.
 - integrate skills with knowledge and concepts.
- It can allow students to develop the practice of independent learning. This way of working is vital at the later stages of secondary education and after.
- Work at home can provide the quiet and private conditions needed for work of all kinds.
- It gives the most enthusiastic students the opportunity to apply their passion and gain a deeper insight into the subject.
- It can allow students to use materials and other sources of information that are not always available in the classroom such as the internet, TV documentaries, and news reports.
- It can involve parents and others in students' work for their mutual benefit.
- It can give opportunities for long term research, enquiries, and other work.
- It can form an important part of the student's notes in preparation for the next lesson.
- It gives students valuable experience of working to deadlines.

After weeks of preparation, on Saturday 8 March, this year's mock trial team travelled to Worcester Magistrates' Court to compete in the local heat of the national mock trial competition. The case was R vs Davidson, in which the defendant had allegedly been in possession of an offensive weapon (a broken glass bottle at a football stadium). In the first trial, the defendant, our very own Mollie Williams, was found not guilty, but in our next trial our prosecution team dominated the other school, and gained a guilty verdict.

The whole team performed brilliantly; they were all articulate and confident in their roles and worked together in a way legal professionals would. Amongst the dignitaries observing were: the Lord Lieutenant of Worcestershire; His Honour Judge Cartwright; and Steve Mackay from the Police and Crime Commissioner's Office. students. In fact Ruby Britton was described as 'frankly terrifying' as the lead prosecutor and was awarded the 'Most Outstanding' trophy. Even more thrilling though, was the team victory!
