Online safety: online relationships & dating apps

Dating apps have grown rapidly in popularity since their introduction, transforming the way many people meet and form new relationships. Whilst these platforms are typically restricted to an audience of over 18s, there are still children and young people attempting to make use of them and exposing themselves to serious risks from online harassment to abuse. As a parent/carer, it can be daunting to navigate this complex and ever evolving landscape, and to know how best you can support and protect your child who may be accessing dating apps. Aosta 2025

Last week 36 students and 4 members of staff headed to Pila, Italy for the Lacon Childe School Ski Trip 2025. Early on Sunday morning we flew from Birmingham and travelled from Geneva to Pila, arriving at the Hotel Miage just in time for dinner. That night students met our ski rep, Fez, a lovely Australian who was great at getting us excited about our trip before settling into their rooms, organising their ski gear and preparing for their first day on the slopes.

Monday morning dawned and we headed to ski fit where students were equipped with boots, skis and poles before heading up the mountain to meet their ski instructors. Stepping out of the gondola we found near perfect conditions. Blue skies, sunshine and fresh snowfall the night before – we could not have wished for better. The first morning the instructors spent time assessing students' skills and arranging groups to best suit the different abilities. After that there was no stopping our students. By the next day even those who had never been on skis before were headed up the mountain on chair lifts and gondolas away from nursery slopes

to tackle routes and runs to challenge their new skills. A group of students who were more experienced skiers found themselves on mogul runs and finding piste side jumps with their Argentinian instructor, Juan.

In the evenings we were able to walk into the town of Aosta to do some sightseeing and visit a local ice cream parlour, we had a night bowling and also an 'all you can eat' pizza night at a local restaurant. Each evening students wrote nominations for 'doughnut of the day', mostly given for spectacular crashes and muppet moments, with the winners for that day having to wear some suitably daft hats to identify them the following day.

As the week continued the progression made by Lacon Childe students was unbelievable. All students were able to ski red runs with one group even progressing to complete the hardest black runs. Thanks to the hard work of our instructors and the resilience of the students, all students had gained an impressive new set of skills. It was a pleasure to see them take on the challenge and support each other through the highs and lows of learning a new skill whilst being away from home.

As Friday afternoon arrived, after one last snowball fight and hot chocolate, we loaded forty weary bodies back onto the coach to Geneva headed back to Lacon Childe School.

The 2025 trip will be remembered for many things. More lost gloves and goggles than ever before......more snow than we had ever hoped for.....no vegetables for dinner.....skiing in the clouds.....more doughnuts of the day than ever, the list goes on. However, the biggest stand out was the exceptional behaviour and good humour of our students. They were a pleasure to travel with and ski instructors, hotel staff and members of the public in airports all commented on what a credit they were to our school. Lastly a big thank you to the members of staff, Mr Roff, Mrs Stokes and Mr Blair for all of their hard work over the week supporting our students. A special thank you goes to Mrs Harding for organising and leading our ski trip, your hard work is very much appreciated.

The ski trip runs every two years. The next trip will be in March 2027 and will be launched in September 2025.
