# **Y11 GCSE Maths revision support**

Just a reminder to Y11 students that the best way to revise maths is to DO MATHS! Each maths teacher gives their students a past paper every week to complete, however students can use the following websites to access more past papers and mark schemes so that they can practice. This is the most effective way to revise maths. The more papers you do, the more marks you get! Students can either print them off at home or can work from the screen onto a notepad. Teachers are happy to mark any additional papers that students wish in order to help them address any areas they are unsure of.

Lastly each student has been given two sets of red-amber-green sheets that shows their strengths and areas to develop based on the mock examinations they took. This is highly personalised feedback that has instant impact as students can address the improvement areas immediately by typing the code into SPARX maths. If students need another copy, they can ask their maths teacher and they can email it over. Please encourage your child to prepare for their upcoming maths examinations by using a mix of past paper practice and the SPARX platform independent learning area.

#### Post 16 travel assistance 2025/26

As you may be aware Post 16 travel assistance is a discretionary area, however, Shropshire Council currently offers assistance in the form of a contribution scheme. The contribution scheme for the 2025/26 is as follows, the main charge is £1140 per year. For families on defined benefits (please see below), a contribution towards the cost of travel assistance will be £330 for the academic year. Please note the contribution is required for all students regardless of the type of assistance received.

#### **Defined Benefits**

- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Support
- Free School Meals (as authorised by the Authority, not the school that your child is attending.)
- Child Tax Credit with annual income, as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs, of less than £16,190 on 1st September 2024 or subsequently on the date of application.
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Universal credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- The guaranteed element of pension credit

Travel assistance is currently provided based on an assessment of the applicant's individual needs. All applicants are assessed to make sure they meet the Post/16 travel assistance criteria. We would like to encourage our parent/carers of current Year 11 students to visit Shropshire Council's application pages. The deadline to ensure assistance can be put in place for September is 30<sup>th</sup> June 2025. (applications received after this date will still be processed but could be delayed). Please note, if travel assistance is offered in the form of a Council contracted vehicle this is on a shared basis and will only be offered at the beginning and end of the standard school/college day.
