Vapes and 'energy sticks'

It has been brought to our attention that some of our students are purchasing vapes in and around our local community and surrounding villages. The sale of vapes and e-liquid in the UK has very clear laws. It is illegal to buy and sell these products under the age of 18. Vaping is age-restricted in the UK primarily to protect young people from nicotine which is highly addictive, and research suggests that exposure during adolescence can have long-term effects on brain development. In addition to the issue our children face in terms of navigating the growing trend of vaping, there is now another cause for concern, known as "Energy Sticks".

Energy sticks, which are two-pronged nasal inhalers, appear to have hit the UK and like their vape counterparts are causing young people to get addicted. Often taking the shape and form of an air pod case, these sticks are artificially flavoured and claim to give users an energy boost. Based on research by laboratories in China, these unregulated sticks often contain a mixture of camphor, menthol, eucalyptus oils, alcohol, lead, mercury and nicotine. Some sticks have also been found to contain vitamin E acetate; an additive found in e-cigarettes. Such ingredients obviously pose a clear health risk to young people, leading to problems with their respiratory system and lungs, as well as seizures, confusion, delirium and intoxication of the nervous system. Some examples are shown below.



As parents/carers are reminded you that you can:

- Report underage sales of vapes and illegal vape sales to <u>Consumer service: General | Citizens Advice</u> referrals (Shropshire Council) <u>Tip us off at Trading Standards</u> (Worcestershire County Council)
- Discuss with your child the risks associated with energy sticks, illegal vapes and purchasing underage plus the impact of nicotine on their developing brains and mental health (concentration, emotional regulation, memory, lower wellbeing). Please remember that young people can very quickly become addicted to nicotine which can have a lifelong impact including on their future health.
- Conduct regular searches of children's bedrooms and belongings in order to keep them safe from harm.
